Reporting about ongoing activities in the area of OpenGLAM

We are planning to make more active use of the OpenGLAM CH blog. Jürg Hagmann, Louis Gantner and Frédéric Noyer are ready to contribute blog posts. All the others are invited to do so as well. Occasional posts can be sent to Beat Estermann who will publish them on the platform; regular contributors can have their own user account. Posts should focus on OpenGLAM related topics and be in line with OpenGLAM principles. Contributors are welcome to discuss the topics of their posts in advance with Beat Estermann if they have any doubts whether they are appropriate for the OpenGLAM CH site.

Discussion about the profile and functioning of our working group

<u>Issues raised / proposals made:</u>

- For one participant, coming regularly together to share information and exchange experiences is not enough. If the focus is on this, they won't participate in future meetings.
- Our primary target group are heritage institutions, including institutions responsible for the preservation of historical monuments and archeological sites. The first step towards the realization of OpenGLAM consists in opening up collections.
- In a further step we may also focus on further target groups by thinking of the entire ecosystem that is involved in OpenGLAM.
- Please don't refer to heritage institutions as "cultural heritage institutions" or "cultural institutions" as this excludes state archives according to some definitions (e.g. the Federal Archives don't perceive themselves as a cultural institution).
- The working group could serve as an "exchange platform" (in real life) to promote the "Open" approach. We can make it easier for other GLAMs to embrace an "open" approach by producing information and instruction material to address all kinds of topics. We should cover both the "Why?" and the "How" of OpenGLAM.
- Information and instruction material should be targeted at different target groups within institutions (especially in larger institutions, there is a high level of specialization among staff). It may also be useful to target information and instruction material at various GLAM profiles.
- It is important to tell success stories, thereby including aspects that are important to decision makers. We need to convince the people who spend money.
- We should as much as possible use existing structures and existing groups to promote OpenGLAM (e.g. the working group « Zugang und Vermittlung » of the Swiss Association of Archivists) and refrain from organizing a special OpenGLAM conference

- The model followed by the National Library and various members of the OpenGLAM
 working group to promote OpenGLAM in the context of the annual meeting of
 cantonal libraries could be applied in other contexts to reach further groups of
 GLAMs.
- It should be made clear what the goals of each person in the working group are.
- We should decide whether we want the OpenGLAM working group to act more like a collective pursuing common activities and having a strong common identity or more like a loose network with partners cooperating around projects in varying configurations.
- In order to get more heritage institutions to open up their collections, it is suggested that we proceed according to the following steps:
 - Define/understand the target group(s)
 - o Prepare material to convince them
 - Identify and describe best practices for opening up collections
 - Foster re-use

Decision:

- There is a strong tendency among the meeting participants in favor of the working group functioning more like a loose network of partners than a collective pursuing a clearly defined set of common activities. In order to think this over and give working group members who are absent the possibility to express their views, the decision is deferred to the next meeting.
- The next meeting will take place before the summer break and address the following points:
 - What do we want to achieve with our institution / as individuals in the area of OpenGLAM?
 - O What do we want to achieve with the working group?
 - O How do we proceed in order to achieve the goals of the working group?

• GLAMs make available more content on Wikimedia Commons (Federal Archives, ETH Library, National Library) **** [+ JH]

ETH Library: release of pictures under "free" license is pending.

Contact with Museum.BL (connection to EEXCESS project).

Contact with Mission 21 and Wirtschaftsarchiv Glarus in Schwanden.

Drafted a flyer.

The goal is to provide a professional service for digitization, uploads to Wikimedia Commons, etc.

Contacts with Swiss Museums Association and FB KGS BABS as well as WP Community in view of contacting Swiss heritage institutions on a large scale asking them to contribute content to Wikipeida. (Beat Estermann).

WMCH / SUPSI: Alps project - The main goal is the creation of a virtual library and of a central entry point on the internet where researchers in this area can find "high quality" material and are invited to contribute further material. (Ilario Valdelli, Iolanda Pensa)

Task Force "Platform" Meeting on 17 March 2014:

Focus activities on existing platforms.

Ideas how the present situation should be improved: better use of synergies between platforms; overview of existing data/content vs. open data/content. Ideas how the OpenGLAM CH working group could foster the population of existing platforms: document processes and best practices; identify and help removing bottlenecks and obstacles

WG should partner with umbrella organizations and providers of existing platforms the profile of the WG should be clarified: goals; mission; stakeholder groups and ways of engaging with them; do we want to focus on requesting vs. supporting/enabling? what is the use of our working group? what is our unique selling proposition?

The task force is dormant as there was a lack of interest/commitment among participants to continue the task force.

Swiss Theatre Platform (Swiss Theatre Collection, BFH, and partners)

Preparations are ongoing. Further communication if project gets funded.

Regarding platforms that may have connections to the OpenGLAM topic: the prepatory works for a Swiss research data platform are on a good way. Further communication by André Golliez will follow when the funding decision has been made.

b) Engaging online communities / crowdsourcing:

• Cooperations between GLAMs and Wikimedia/Wikipedia: content uploads, common events and projects (WMCH, National Library)

Swiss National Library: WiRs, editing workshop for beginners (9 participants). Open editing workshop planned in May as well as edit-a-thon about picture uploads from the Swiss Federal Archives.

Small image upload to Commons. (problem: contracts that are not very clear). Plan for 2016 Gotthard exhibition with WP-related part (e.g. QRpedia) Building up an infrastructure to use the GLAMWiki Toolset.

Launch of SwissGLAMmies as a promotional tool for content from various institutions that have uploaded images to Wikimedia Commons.

BAR: Establishment of GLAM-Wiki cooperation as an operational task (this is important in view of sustainability)

- Crowdsourcing e-manuscripta -> transcription tool, images (ETH Library)
- Exhibitions with editathon, e.g. Gotthard 2016 (National Library) [+ DB, MS]
 In preparation
- Further photo contests similar to Wiki Loves Monuments In preparation (challenge: few volunteers interested in organizing the contest). Contest in summer 2014, still looking for the topic (landscapes, living traditions).

Open Street Map Tagging
